
Drought Advisory #2 – PLEASE READ

The governor has ordered mandatory cuts in water use to start June 1 2 days per week for 5 minutes total per station

Although there are variations of what is being policed for different agencies throughout San Diego County (SEE #2 BELOW), these reductions on irrigation stations that aren't upgraded to efficient, low-flow spray nozzles, for which there are currently rebates (SEE #3, 5 AND 6 BELOW) available! will result in stressed landscaping. What this means to our partnership is for: areas of your landscape watered by non-rotating, high or normal flow spray nozzles, the reduction to 2 days per week

WILL RESULT IN BROWN GRASS and STRESSED PLANTS


